THE ENVIRONMENT CORNER: CFL's and YOU - BY: Jim Sprague

If you're wondering why so many stores are displaying Compact Fluorescent Light bulbs (CFLs) these days, it's for good reason. Starting in 2012, the "old style" incandescent light bulbs we've used for generations will be phased out, and replaced by the new kid on the block: CFLs. While this may require some minor adjustments on our parts, it will be a boon to our environment...and our pocketbooks. Consider this:

Just ONE Energy Star-qualified CFL can:

- * Save more than \$40 in electricity costs
- * Use about 75% less energy and last up to 10 times longer than a standard incandescent bulb
- * Produce about 75% less heat, thereby cutting energy costs associated with home cooling

If every American home replaced just one light with an Energy Star-rated CFL, we'd save enough energy to light 3 million homes for a year, save about \$600 million in annual energy costs, and prevent 9 billion pounds of greenhouse gas emissions per year...the equivalent to those from about 800,000 cars.

As you might guess, CFLs aren't perfect for all lighting applications. For example, low-watt (10-40 watts) decorative bulbs, such as for chandeliers, are exempt. And since CFLs take a bit more time to come to full brightness, you may not want to use them in closets or staircases. What's more, special CFLs are required for use with dimmers and 3-way sockets. But for most lightning needs, they work just great.

Spring cleaning time is almost upon us! The annual Tioga Terrace Garage Sale will be held on Saturday, May 21th. This is a great opportunity to clean out those overstuffed garages, attics, and basements. As in years past, TTCA will hire Tioga County Sheriff's Department Deputies to ensure orderly traffic flow, and accessibility for emergency vehicles. Your Tioga Terrace Civic Association will also provide two porta-potties on Highland Drive between Frederick and Overbrook.

Ad Space For Sale!!! TTCA will again be selling maps of Tioga Terrace to attendees for a nominal cost. Ad space is available for sale on the maps. Text ads can be approximately 100 characters in length and are \$5 each. Business card size ads with logos are available for \$10 each. <u>Help Wanted</u> - TTCA is looking for volunteers to organize future garage sales. Please contact Jeff or Wendy Wood for more information.

<u>Day of the Sale</u> Traffic Flow: As in years past, parking on Frederick Drive and Glann Road will be limited to one side to facilitate one-way traffic on those roads. Directional signs will be placed on the affected streets the night before and removed after the event. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. Also, remember to give yourself a few extra minutes leaving and entering the Terrace on Garage Sale day.

Food Vendors: Food Vendors must have permits from the Town of Owego and are reminded that they must comply with permit conditions. The permit ONLY allows stops in the street for 10-15 minutes before moving on.

<u>Food/Beverages</u>: Food and beverages should be pre-packaged. Food handlers of non-pre-packaged items must have access to running water for hand washing. Be aware that the Tioga County Health Department may do spot inspections.

<u>Commercial Vendors</u>: Many commercial vendors are drawn to the Terrace by the number of people attending the Garage Sale. If you are hosting a commercial vendor, please ask them to consider a donation to the TTCA to help offset the cost of organizing the Garage Sale. Vendors making donations by May 7th will be listed on the maps described above.

Volunteer Naturalist Meetings April 13th, and May 11th 9:30 – 10:30 AM - All volunteers are invited to our meeting to discuss opportunities for helping out at Waterman Conservation Education Center. If you are not yet involved, this is the perfect time to start. Volunteers are needed to help with school classes, at special events and more. Bring a friend.

Butterfly Club Meets at Waterman Center - This free, informal club is designed to share information about butterflies and moths in our area with all ages and levels of knowledge. Meetings are held at Waterman Center. The next meeting will be held Saturday, March 26 at 2-3:30 PM. Feel free to come once or as often as you like. No membership required.

Meetings have been held one Saturday a month with a brief power point presentation that features where to look for common butterflies of our region and the plants they require. A new topic is presented at each meeting. Tables are set up with information about field guides and other resource materials. Pesticide-free plant recommendations for nectar and caterpillar food are available. There is a butterfly craft table. In the spring and summer, naturalist Colleen Wolpert will change the format of the meetings and welcome club members to join her on butterfly walks to observe butterflies in their natural habitat. Along the way, Colleen will help you develop your butterfly watching skills. Children must be accompanied by an adult. These walks will run

weather permitting. Meetings will be indoors if the weather is not favorable. Because of the nature of this type of observing, walks will be scheduled when certain species emerge. More information will be available as the season progresses. We hope you can join us!

The Raptor Project with Jonathan Wood May 13th and 14th - The Raptor Project with master falconer, Jonathan Wood, is coming to Waterman Center on Friday and Saturday, May 13 and 14. This popular program features 15-20 live birds of prey, including owls, hawks, falcons and a golden eagle. Reservations are required for any of the 4 shows: Friday at 7 PM, Saturday at 10 AM, 12 PM and 2 PM. This is one of the most unique wildlife presentations in the nation and is enjoyed by people of all ages. Adults: \$10 for members/\$12 for non-members. Kids: 5-12 are \$5 for members/\$6 for non-members. Children under 5 are free.

New York State Safe Boating Class – a 4 week course - The NYS Safe Boating Class will be held in May at Waterman Center. It is a series of 4 classes that meet one evening a week from 6:30-9 PM. Dates for the 4 classes will be announced. This class prepares you



for the Personal Watercraft test. This is required in order to receive a NYS Boat Safety Certificate. Book and materials will be provided. Test for licensing will be the last day of class. Registration Required. \$12.00 per student for building use.

Colleen Wolpert teaches the butterfly classes at Waterman and leads bird walks. Bring a walking stick, as we will be walking to the falls. The trail at the IBM Glen, Endwell, is moderate in difficulty. Please wear sturdy shoes. Dogs are not allowed at hikes. Registration requested. 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


BRUSH PICKUP - BY JOHN CURRENT
